

SciTech (NEF Presenter June 2008) completed its pre-IND process with the FDA, clearing a path for the company to complete its pre-clinical toxicology studies and apply with the FDA to conduct Phase I clinical trials in humans. Husk Insulation Ian Dailey, CEO, Presenter

Husk Insulation is an early-stage firm that converts plant-based agricultural waste into high-grade insulation that is a fraction of the thickness of conventional insulation. The Husk insulated panels will be used initially in refrigeration (\$260M market), and eventually in refrigerated trucking and housing (\$1B market). The Company recently shared the \$100K Clean Energy Prize, a competition for alternative energy start-ups sponsored by the University of Michigan and DTE Energy. The management team includes individuals experienced in high-tech, chemical engineering, marketing, and finance. They are seeking consultant assistance for scale-up, then will be hiring both a VP Operations and an experienced CEO.

The Pitch Premise was for the First North American Land Deal, i.e., the voyage of Christopher Columbus to the New World. The problem: Queen Isabella wants someone other than Chris to make the voyage; that person would become Viceroy of All New Land and would control revenues and positions. What opportunities awaited? How would each entrepreneur tap those resources to provide the gigantic financial return the venture's benefactors, Queen Isabella and King Ferdinand, expected?

Champ Beedon proposed using Chris as CTO, finding Tonto, who speaks the people's language, and initially commercializing an agricultural crop that would be rolled and smoked; later developing computer-assisted roadways and a thing called cars.

Linkner acknowledged that dreams are good, but doing is better. He proposed reducing risk with an award-winning team (Bill Gates, Steve Jobs, Arnold Greenspan) obtained through a patented time machine that would also import future technology, including Twitter and GPS.

Brophy hulked up with maize and blue muscles and spelled out his plan for profits in a Village People chant (P-R-O-F-I-T), stressing his plan was cheaper, better -- but who was listening?

Klein's "safer and faster" plan would claim more land, he said, and increase the initial \$10M in revenues by means of a "place beamer" that was safe for dogs, monkeys, and kids...? And cost \$19.99 each...? Perhaps I missed something during the thunderous laughter?


